







The Pathways Home Transitional Housing Project (Pathways Home) is an innovative tri partite partnership between PAYCE, Women's Community Shelters (WCS) and Bridge Housing Limited to manage housing land-banked for future development, to provide housing for women and children leaving emergency crisis accommodation.

## **BACKGROUND**

- There is a lack of affordable housing for women exiting crisis shelters, particularly those not entitled to mainstream housing supports or private rental products until immigration/family law issues are resolved. Consequently, there is a risk that women will remain in a cycle of homelessness or return to perpetrators due to lack of alternative accommodation.
- Pathways Home aims to provide women and children leaving violence with a safe and secure home to rebuild their lives and heal from violence.
   Pathways Home is a partnership initiative between PAYCE, Women's Community Shelters (WCS) and Bridge Housing Limited.
- PAYCE owns the Properties and has undertaken to make properties available for the purposes of the project.
- Bridge Housing will provide property and tenancy management services under the partnership.
- Women's Community Shelters (WCS) operates crisis accommodation for women and children.
   WCS will provide outreach support and identify suitable tenants for housing.

Through this innovative partnership, PAYCE
has nominated Bridge Housing to manage the
properties as transitional housing as part of
Pathways Home and Bridge Housing has agreed
to do so in partnership with WCS who will identify
suitable tenants.

# **PATHWAYS HOME**

This project offers immediate and comprehensive shelter services to women and children at risk of homelessness after transitioning from WCS crisis accommodation.

Homeless women and children will enjoy stable housing and support services, for up to 18 months and will develop skills necessary to sustain their housing independently.

WCS will provide ongoing case management and support services as part of their outreach programme and educate women about their responsibilities as tenants.

PAYCE will provide five properties (in North West Sydney) in kind and undertake modifications to ensure the properties are fit for purpose. The PAYCE Foundation will provide seed funding for the Pathways Home Project Fund to support responsive maintenance and other costs.

Bridge Housing will manage the tenancy and undertake responsive maintenance.

WCS will assess clients suitable for housing and provide outreach supports. Effective support functions will include: educating clients about their responsibilities as a tenant; advocating on behalf of clients to address tenancy issues; acting as an intermediary to facilitate communication between the client and housing provider; educating clients re: their financial responsibilities and budgeting skills; and assisting clients to heal from violence and work through substance use, mental health problems and other barriers to recovery.

Lease or occupancy agreements will be implemented that set out tenancy rights and obligations. Leases will be renewed every 6 months and allow for case work to support and review strategies to enable successful transition to private rental at the end of the period.

The project will provide a practical example of how community organisations can work with private companies and leverage philanthropy to develop affordable housing opportunities for people in need.

### **PROJECT STATUS**

- The first families will transition from a WCS shelter to the transitional housing in early November 2017.
- The partners hope to grow the project and will engage with other developers to increase the supply of transitional accommodation for women and children in need.
